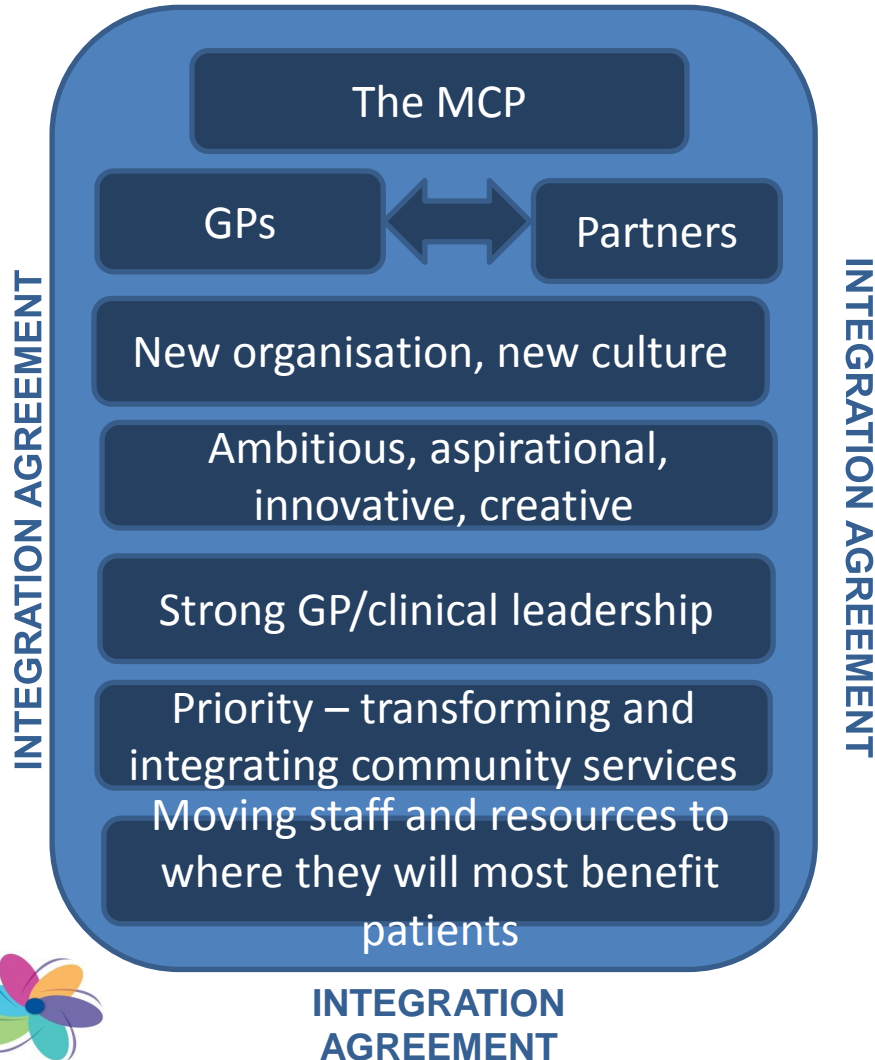
Some of Our Recent Achievements

- We used the opportunity created by being a vanguard to create GP champions who form a steering group.
- The steering group represents the GP practices in the collaborative.
- Each locality is represented on the steering group.
- Practices are encouraged to join the collaborative to benefit from investments in primary care from the vanguard.

Our Aspirations for the MCP

What Happens Next

- Market engagement event on 19th January identified providers interested in being a main contractor on the model
- Process underway to select provider(s) led by the GP collaborative and supported by a project team
- Once providers are selected they will need to respond to the CCG procurement process
- Integration agreement to be developed, agreed and signed between primary care and the new MCP provider
- Option for GP practices to select either a partially or fully integrated model for their practice
- Contract award by end of 2017 with mobilisation in 2018
